Newspaper recycling/collection is up 33%; 1697 tons of waste newspapers were collected from July to Dec. 1981. In our area the collection days are the 1st and 3rd Thursdays of the month. Daily newspaper collection schedules are announced on a 24 hour recording at 558-2155. It is important to put them out on the correct day because of the litter problem. Newspapers may be deposited at the Resource Recovery Center at the Cherrydale Safeway parking lot, 3713 Lee Hwy. For street pickup, place newspapers in brown grocery bag or tie in bundles and place on curb by 6:30 A.M. with other refuse to be collected. If your papers are not picked up, call Public Works 558-2321. Remember, for every ton o paper recycled, 17 trees can be saved, and take the little trouble to prepare newspapers for recycling.
