Neighborhood Watch - It Works! Crime is Reduced!

To participate we must organize by area, or block, with block captains. The police will gladly come to help you get started and give each member a folder on crime watch. 75% participation is required for the following: 1. Crime safety survey of your home by the police, giving recommendations. Compliance of recommendations if not required. 2. Certain equipment (such as TV's and stereos) are to be marked for identification if stolen. 3. Learm about being observant of crime and reporting it. 4. NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH signs purchased by the group as deterrants (THEY WORK). Block Captains call Donna P. Anderson 892-5939 for coordination.
