January Meeting: Focus on Route 50 Crossing and Columbia Pike Traffic

Traffic will again be the topic of this month's meeting of the Barcroft School and Civic League. But the focus this time will be on the dangerous Route 50 crossing at Henderson Road, along with a discussion of ways to encourage motorists to use George Mason Drive instead of cutting through the neighborhood.

The county at one time planned to close the Henderson Road crossing, but that plan is apparently not on the books anymore. Still, some in the neighborhood wonder what can be done to make the crossing safer, given the frequent -- and sometimes deadly -- accidents there. Addressing these and other questions will be Sherrell Crow, a Virginia Department of Transportation

official. Mr. Crow is a former county employee so is familiar with the neighborhood. Crow hopes to do a quick survey of traffic at George Mason and Columbia Pike before the meeting.

All are encouraged to come with questions and suggestions. The meeting begins at 7:30 p.m., on Thursday, January 7 -- the first Thursday of the month, as always. See you there.

Trav Fick Bites his Nails in Impatience

The traffic committee reported the BCSL support for the traffic measures approved at the November 5 BSCL meeting to Jeff Sikes, our contact and planner at Public Works. Mr. Sikes advised us to wait for the process guidelines to be established by the County Traffic Calming Committee. Yikes! Setting up the process may take a year! (The nails that Trav bites, for your

information, are the masonry type. His dentist does not approve.) To calm Trav, BCSL Traffic Committee Chairperson Elaine Squeri joined the Civic Federation Transportation Committee to network and to learn what it will take to effect traffic changes.

Meanwhile, since November 5, Barcrofters have phoned in or written additional comments about traffic in our neighborhood. One asked that neighbors check their properties and cut back shrubbery that obstructs access to roads like Wakefield and Buchanan, particularly at 7th and Buchanan and 9th at Wakefield. Several others called about the dangerous intersection of Henderson and Route 50. At the Civic Federation on December 1, this issue was raised as well and Randy Swart, President of the Federation, clarified that the scope of the Traffic Calming Committee is neighborhood streets only; this huge task has already taken two years of intensive work to create the plan and final report which was just approved. Therefore a request was voted by the delegates to ask the County to set up a separate review committee on large streets like Route 50 and other major thoroughfares as well as to review the street classifications in the County as outlined in the Master Transportation Plan of 1986. In conclusion, our hopes for quieting traffic are not isolated but are reflected in many other associations' concerns and are integral to the overall County traffic system.

The Traffic Committee will meet on January 5, Tuesday, to develop interim

approaches to slowing traffic through our neighborhood. Remember that our meetings are open - 7:30 PM at 216 S. Abingdon - and we not only welcome but need new members who can work with us, for example, to implement an education campaign. Trav Fick says "Be There."

Dues Reminder

To date, BSCL Membership for 1998-99 stands at 236 households (396 adult members). This is significantly lower than prior years, and definitely not a majority of Barcroft residents.

Membership shows interest in Barcroft, and only members vote on important neighborhood issues. Further, the larger our membership base, the easier it is to represent the neighborhood in dealings with county or other officials.

A Watershed Event: New Park Being Planned.

Using a grant from the Chesapeake Bay Foundation, Arlingtonians for a Clean Environment (ACE) has begun conceptual planning for a new park to be located at the intersection of the W&OD trail and Columbia Pike (the upper bike path adjacent to the laundromat). The preliminary concept for the park is educational, providing information about the history of Four Mile Run and the impacts of urban development on the creek and the Chesapeake Bay. ACE is considering constructing a turn-around loop for the upper bike path at the intersection with Columbia Pike, and providing interpretive signs to educate trail users about environmental stewardship and the importance of healthy local streams.

The more long-range concepts for the park are starting to be developed. ACE feels it is critically important to involve the neighborhood groups, including BSCL and

our neighbors in Columbia Heights West. As this site is within the Barcroft neighborhood boundaries, we can be instrumental in providing funding for the project through an NCAC grant. Therefore, BSCL needs to provide our vision for the project area. Some of the preliminary elements being considered for the park include: benches, art work, environmentally-friendly landscaping, a mini soccer field, water fountains, creek overlooks, lighting, etc. ACE would like to include multi-cultural elements to attract more citizens from the diverse population living nearby. Security and a transient population currently utilizing the park are also topics of discussion.

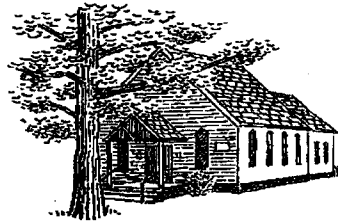

County Identifies Possible Historic Districts

The County's Historic Preservation Office reports that a consultant has recently completed a survey of historic resources, and that the survey identified four areas that might be eligible as historic districts, including a section of Barcroft. We have not yet read the report to see what section that might be, but copies are available by calling the Historic Preservation Office at 228-3830 or in the Virginia Room of the Central Library.

The County currently has designated 28 Local Historic Districts, including our Barcroft Community House and a large section of Maywood neighborhood. Although the designation offers some protection for a neighborhood, it does involve having every external modification of any significance (painting the shutters a new color or adding a porch, for example) approved after detailed scrutiny by the Historic Affairs and Landmark Review Board. The Board must issue a Certificate

of Appropriateness before the homeowner can undertake the modification.

Bird Food

This recipe for Drumlin Farm Bird Pudding will give our Barcroft birds a treat for the new year. Ingredients: 1 pound of lard, 1 cup hot water, 2 cups oatmeal, 1 cup flour, 4 cups wild birdseed. Instructions: Soften the lard in a large pan over low heat. Add other ingredients and mix well. Place in birdfeeder and watch the birds flock!
